

The NSW Government's \$632 million investment in the Campbelltown Hospital redevelopment is delivering a major upgrade in health services for our region. This month signals the beginning of the carpark works.

Carpark update

In 2019 Campbelltown Hospital is planning to provide new and additional staff and public car parking with a new seven-level carpark facility. The new multi-storey carpark will be located parallel to Appin Rd on the eastern side of the hospital campus.

We expect construction of the new multi-storey carpark to start later in 2018, pending planning approvals. Construction is planned to be completed in 2019. In order to prepare for the start of the construction works, three ground-level carparks need to be developed on the Campbelltown Hospital campus.

We are pleased to announce that AW Edwards is the successful construction tenderer for the car park early works. Construction is expected to start as early as Friday 29 June 2018 with the erection of fencing.

As the work begins, we ask that all patients and visitors remain alert in their pedestrian and vehicle movements across the site to ensure the safety of everyone, at all times. We ask for your patience and understanding over the coming months as construction begins. Other early works include the relocation of the engineering department which currently sits within the construction zone of the new multi-storey carpark.

The architects continue to work hard in finalising our new and refurbished hospital floorplan designs. They anticipate a final design will be ready for approval by August 2018. This will allow us to move forward with **detailed design** later in 2018.

Detailed Design up Next

Detailed design looks at the detail within a room or space, including the fixtures, furnishings and equipment requirements. This is when we get to choose colors for furnishings and facades etc.

FUN FACT: Did you know that if you laid the multi deck car park out end to end, it would extend to approximately. 1.5 kilometres!

What will the project deliver?

Key features include:

- **New clinical services building** with modern wards and patient facilities
- **New women's health services building** including birthing suits and maternity ward
- State of the art **operating theatres** and **intensive care unit**
- **Bigger emergency department** with more treatment spaces
- Increased **medical and surgical children's services**
- **Modern mental health units** that are centrally located
- **Increased access to cancer, outpatient and ambulatory care services**
- **Upgraded** medical imaging equipment
- New services to the hospital, but not included in the new building include **nuclear medicine and dental services**

The redevelopment will improve patient flow, provide better access to the hospital, food and retail outlets and bring increased job opportunities.

Community Forums

The redevelopment team recently had the opportunity to meet with staff and members of the community to answer questions and give an overview of the redevelopment project.

Community forums were held on 31 May in the Campbelltown Hospital foyer and on 2 June at the Civic Centre, Campbelltown Council. These sessions allowed the project team to visually show how the new hospital facilities and spaces may look.

The team discussed the plans and provided artists' impressions of the new clinical services building and indoor spaces.

Consultation with our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander staff and the Tharawal Medical Service is continuing around service planning, design and engagement strategies. Delivering better health outcomes for Aboriginal people remains a key focus of the project.

Feedback is crucial to the success of the project, allowing the broader community to provide insight and contribute their thoughts on their own experiences and needs.

Working directly with the consumers and stakeholders allows the project team to consider a variety of opinions on the redevelopment. The project team looks forward to continuing to organise staff and community forums to share our project's progress and information and gather feedback.

This month, we spoke to one of our longest serving community representatives Sharon Smith to ask her about her feelings on the redevelopment.
