

Welcome to the September edition of the Campbelltown Hospital Redevelopment Newsletter. Planning and design are progressing well and running to schedule. We're excited to announce that we have just completed the Schematic Design phase of the project (Figure A). The Schematic Design phase outlined the location of the floor plates, departments and wards, and the broad architectural design.

The Project's State Significant Development Application has been on public exhibition through the Department of Planning and Environment during September 2018 giving the general public and stakeholders an opportunity to provide commentary and feedback around planning and design. Completion of these activities allows us to progress to tender for construction of the main works, which is anticipated to start early in 2019.

Next steps includes:

- Awaiting outcome of the main works tender process.
- Detailed design-making decisions on interior and exterior building materials and finishes, furniture and equipment, lighting, electrical and plumbing systems.
- Continue focus groups and stakeholder consultation through targeted tours.

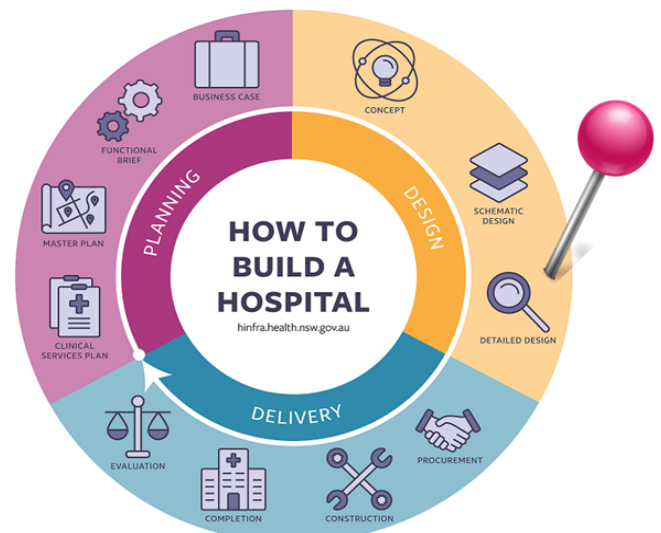

Work is starting to soon to prepare for the excavation of the new clinical services building. The following services will be relocated by the end of 2018 to Building D (Outpatients):

- Discharge Transit Unit and associated drop off/pick up area
- Patient transport
- Equipment loan pool
- In preparation for the closure of the staff cafeteria in October, an additional indoor and outdoor staff seating will be available and is co-located with the Fresh+Café.
