



Marking milestones

The Campbelltown Hospital redevelopment project has recently celebrated a key milestone, with construction completion of the new hospital building – the centrepiece of the \$632 million project. NSW Premier Dominic Perrottet, was joined by Health Minister Brad Hazzard on Thursday 26 May to take a tour of the new building and officially announce construction completion, which also marks commencement of our 12-week move plan.

During the next few months, a range of key services will be relocated to the new building, changing the way you access the hospital.

The first stage of opening will see Main Reception and Cashier services operating from the main entrance foyer on Level 2 of the new building from Monday 6 June, followed by admissions from Wednesday 8 June. The new P3 car park and hospital campus road will also open at the same time, providing a direct link to the new main entrance and these key hospital services. Best access to the main entrance drop-off area, along with the P3 and nearby P2 car parks is via the Central Road and Therry Road entrances. Learn more about upcoming changes [here](#).

The hospital's Emergency Department will relocate into its significantly expanded space within the new building on Wednesday 29 June, with the dedicated P1 car park upgraded to support improved ED parking and drop-off.



Campbelltown Hospital is undergoing its most significant redevelopment since it first opened its doors in 1977, growing and changing to bring world-class healthcare to the Macarthur community. The new 12-storey clinical services building will significantly enhance local healthcare and ensure people living in and moving into the fastest growing region in our state have access to a broad range of key health services, closer to home.

Connection to Country

Campbelltown Hospital is located on the land of the Dharawal people, where there are many reminders of their traditional and ongoing connection to the land. Our new hospital building features a Welcome Stone, Sensory Stone and Healing Circle, which have been selected and designed in consultation and collaboration with local Aboriginal Elders and community members.

Acknowledging the Cumberland Plains that the hospital is built on, these stones will welcome, connect and celebrate the community. The Welcome Stone is located near the front entry and will feature indigenous language inviting you on to Dharawal Country. The Sensory Stone has engraved handprints of local elders that you can touch on your way through the hospital. The third stone selected is located in the external Healing Circle space.

Stocking, storing and filling the floors

With more than 67,000 square metres of new space to fitout, our Furniture, Fittings and Equipment team is hard at work stocking, storing and filling the floors. Joining them has been the tech gurus – our Information Communication Technology team – who are busy connecting, powering and setting up new equipment as it arrives.

Impressive installs

Our new building celebrates the local region and its people through a series of art and design elements. Some of the final pieces to be installed in readiness for the new building opening have been the impressive lyrebird feather sculptures and artwork created by Indigenous artist Nicole Monks. Welcoming you into the new main entrance, a three-metre feather is complemented by a larger sculpture adorning the Hospital Street staircase.
