



Expanding and upgrading

Families in the Macarthur region will continue to have access to the best possible healthcare, with works on the \$632 million Stage 2 redevelopment continuing in the existing hospital buildings.

Set to be completed in late 2023, the expansion and enhancements will increase the hospital's capacity, providing additional services, including nuclear medicine. The increased capacity will support staff to care for patients more effectively and efficiently, with extra equipment and additional space.

The Pharmacy Window on Level 1 of the new hospital building is now open. Placed in the middle of the community hub known as Hospital Street, this space provides entertainment and retail options for people while they wait for their prescriptions.

From redevelopment to decommissioning of the existing hospital buildings, there's even more to come for Campbelltown Hospital and we look forward to keeping you updated.

Farewell to former buildings

We will soon farewell former Building C, with our contractors starting demolition works in the vacated space. The building will be removed to make room for a range of landscaping, which will include an additional entrance.

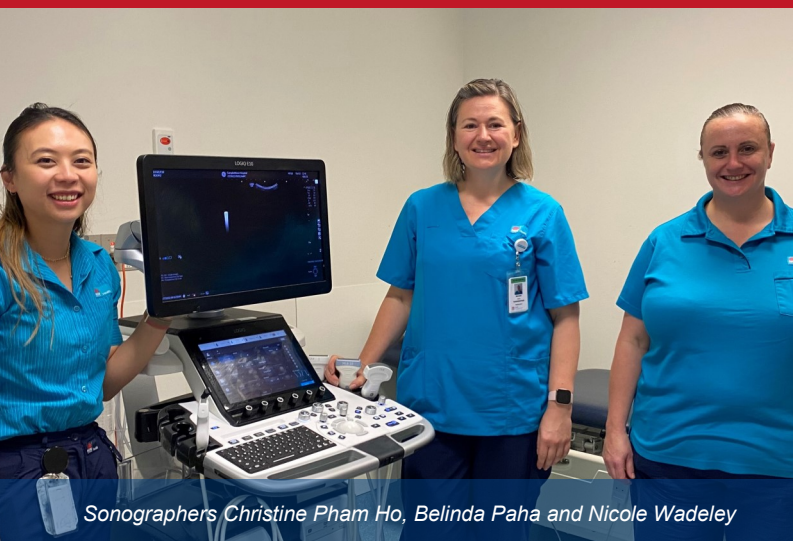
