#### **CONSTRUCTION UPDATE**

With the new hospital building recently reaching its highest point, the focus within the main construction site has now shifted to fitting out the interior and facade.

The vision for the interiors of the 12-storey clinical services building has been designed with extensive input from staff and community in order to reflect the region, its natural assets and its people.

Heavily inspired by nature and the surrounding landscape, spaces have been designed with consideration to colours, textures and patterns that help create a sense of place and wellbeing. We look forward to showcasing some of these exciting plans in future editions, so be sure to keep an eye out for what's to come!

Along with the main build, a range of work sites are currently active across the hospital campus to help ready the site for when the new building becomes operational in late 2022.

From upgrades to essential services and refurbishment works within existing buildings, through to the construction of a new entrance off Therry Road, P1 car park upgrades to support access to the future Emergency Department, an extension to the hospital's loading dock and the creation of a new dental unit, there's certainly a lot happening across the site.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

On completion and opening of the new clinical services building, Campbelltown Hospital will become a major hub for mental health care across the region.

A range of dedicated mental health units will be delivered as part of the Stage 2 redevelopment project, including short stay, adult acute, mental health intensive care unit, high dependency, youth acute and adolescent services, accessed across seven floors within the eastern wing of the new clinical services building.

A modern, specialised older persons' unit and civil secure unit for adults will also be delivered as part of the NSW Government's \$700 million Statewide Mental Health Infrastructure Program.

As a result of the redevelopment project, mental health facilities in Sydney's south western region will see a significant increase in capacity, enhancing the care of patients into the future.
