

What a difference a year makes!

The last 12 months has seen lots of construction activity on the hospital campus – from enabling works and service upgrades that aren't often visible, through to the highly visual commencement of main works which includes construction of the new clinical services building and associated connection works to the existing hospital buildings.

While we'll try to keep disruptions minimal, please be aware that navigation within our buildings, along with vehicle travel and parking access around the hospital campus will change throughout the year as works are carried out.

Coming months will see construction impact travel along the Link Road, with a temporary closure at the northern end to enable electrical infrastructure work beneath the road way. Please be sure to follow signage and instructions from traffic controllers to assist in navigating the site, and allow extra time.

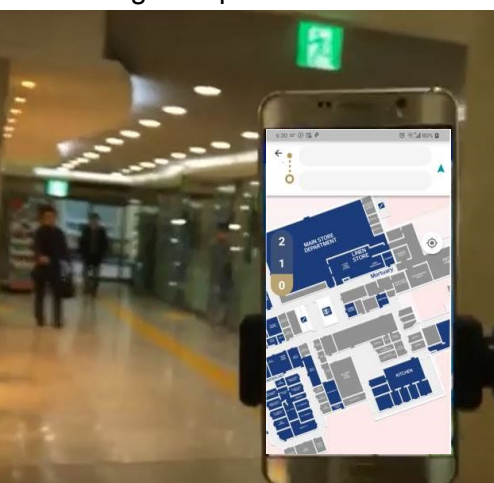
Technology trial leading the way

During February and March, a group of medical staff are trialling a Samsung-developed mobile wayfinding system on the Campbelltown Hospital site.

The trial is part of a research project into potential options to support pedestrian movement around our new hospital once it's complete.

Wayfinding refers to information systems that guide people through a physical environment and enhance their experience of the space. Indoor wayfinding in public buildings such as hospitals is commonly aided by building directories and digital information kiosk systems, similar to the touch screen option currently available on campus. Offering indoor maps for handheld mobile devices is becoming common, and the project team is actively looking at technology options available to assist our visitors in navigating the new and existing buildings into the future.

More than 30 beacons have been installed in the trial areas across three levels of the central building, and a mobile 'app' featuring maps of the hospital floor plan is helping users identify their current location and get directions to where they need to go – just like Google maps.



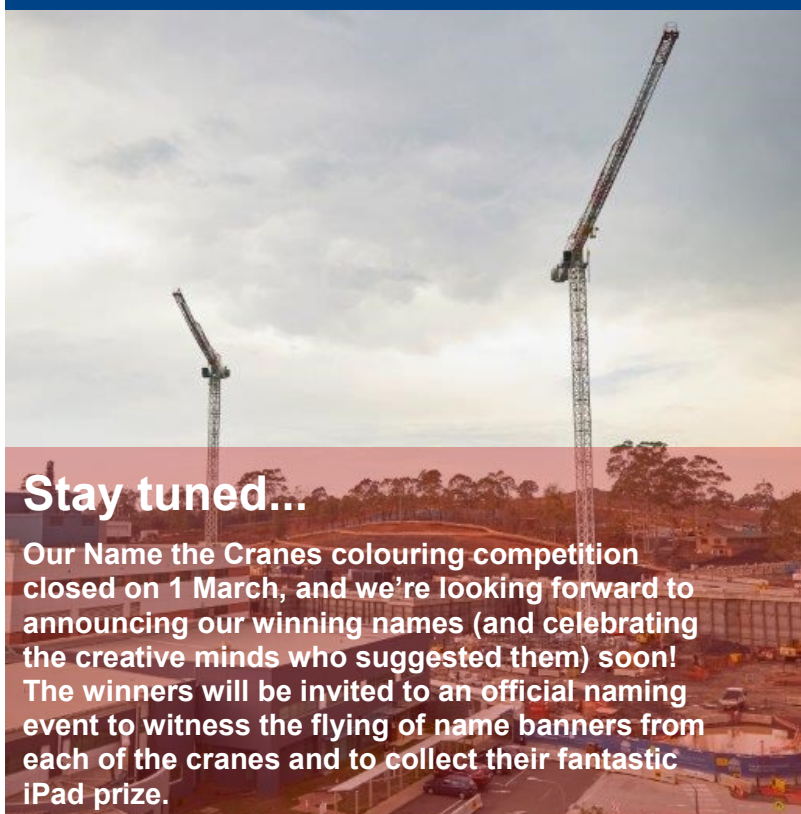
Following the trial, medical staff will provide feedback around their experience, helping to guide the project team's decision making around wayfinding strategy development for the new build.
