Campbelltown Hospital's new \$34.1 million multi-storey car park has reached its highest point with a special ceremony to mark the important construction milestone. Member for Camden Peter Sidgreaves was a special guest at the "topping out" event, honouring a Scandinavian tradition of placing an evergreen tree at the highest

point of the building. "I am delighted the car park is nearing completion," Camden and Campbelltown Hospitals General Manager Alison Derrett said. "The car park will provide our patients, staff and community with improved parking for well into the future. This is a fantastic milestone for our hospital and community."

Jobs for young workers



Campbelltown Hospital's \$632 million redevelopment is offering apprentices and cadets the opportunity to start their careers in the construction industry.

Trainees are making an outstanding contribution to the building of the new multi-storey car park with contractor A W Edwards employing two carpentry, two plumbing, one formwork and four electrical apprentices and three site cadets on the project. A W Edwards is one of three building contractors onsite this year - each involved in a different area of the redevelopment.

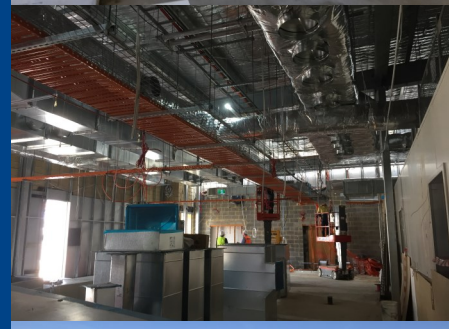
A W Edwards is constructing the new engineering workshop and kitchen extension in addition to the multi-storey car park.



Construction update



- ⇒ Excavation for the new Clinical Services Building is progressing well.
- ⇒ First footings for the new Clinical Services Building have been poured.
- ⇒ The first tower crane will be installed in December 2019.
- ⇒ Construction of the multi-storey car park is expected to be completed early in 2020.
- ⇒ Work on the kitchen (stage 1) and new engineering facilities is expected to be finished in December 2019.
- ⇒ Earthworks and landscaping to parkland around the Link Road and Car Park 2 are expected to be completed in December 2019.
- ⇒ Site investigations for the new Linac (linear accelerator) are underway on the site adjacent to the Macarthur Cancer Therapy Centre.
