



CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

If you have visited the hospital lately you will have seen that there are a lot of changes happening around the site with changes to car parking in some areas and fenced off construction zones popping up.

Our new \$34 million multi-storey carpark is starting to emerge from the ground with concrete trucks pouring new suspended decks every few days.

A new carpark level is being completed approximately every 10 days so it won't be long now until the full 7 levels can be seen.

The new carpark will open in 2020.



DID YOU KNOW?

A minimum of 85% of materials will be collected from a demolition site for recycling.

Scrap is sorted with bricks and concrete waste being crushed and re-purposed as fill or gravel. Timber can be turned into mulch and metals are sent to recycling centres to be used elsewhere.

Any salvageable materials are recovered and reused.

Campbelltown Hospital Redevelopment Team Acting Director Julia Mrkonja has been recognised for her inspirational achievements within the hospital.

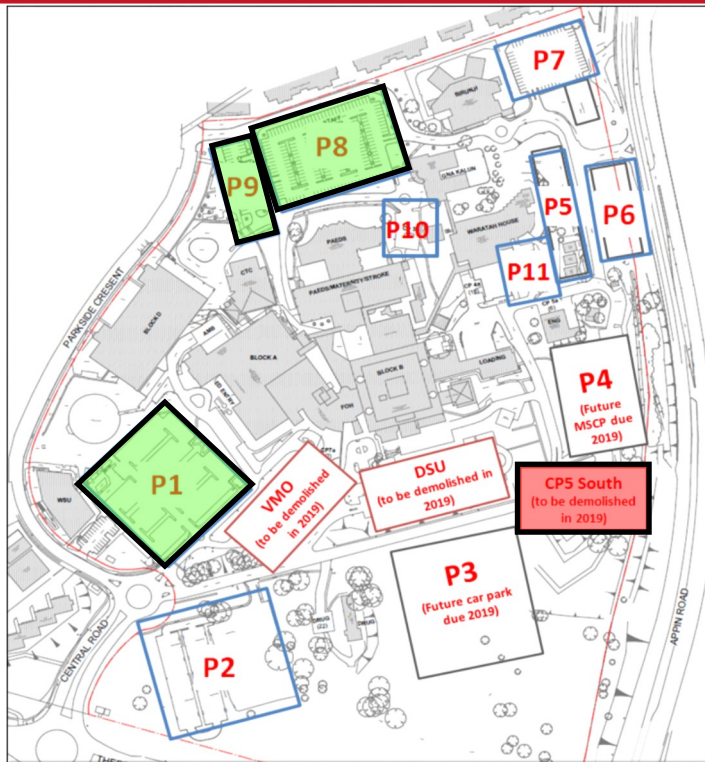
Julia was one of 15 women to be recognised across all professions in the hospital at a ceremony held on International Women's Day on 8 March 2019.
