Campbelltown Drug Health Services has moved



Camden and Campbelltown Hospital GM Alison Derrett and the Drug Health Services team outside their new facility in Building D.

For more than 20 years Campbelltown Drug Health Services have been located in the cottage on the hill, where clients and staff often felt separated from the hospital. As part of the \$632 million redevelopment of Campbelltown Hospital, our Drug Health Services unit have been the first to benefit from new facilities, with the refurbishment of a space on the ground floor of Building D, officially opened on 20 August 2019.

Acting Operational Nurse Manager Wanda Brabender said she and her team were delighted with the new location: "We now have a state-of-the-art facility where we can achieve evidence based treatment in a positive custom built environment. The new space, easily accessible from Parkside Crescent, allows Campbelltown Drug Health services to be located within the hospital ensuring a streamlined, multidisciplinary approach to client care."
