OVER 3000 MED GAS OUTLETS TESTED

Medical gas testing was recently completed in the new clinical services building to ensure all outlets were operating correctly. With more than 3000 medical gas outlets, it was a big week of work.

Accompanied by an anaesthetist, the team ensured all outlets provided the correct air flow with compatible attachments. From oxygen, suction, nitrous oxide and more, the tests passed with flying colours.

COMING IN FOR LANDING

On Wednesday 30 March the first helicopter landed on the new clinical services building rooftop helipad. The test flight allowed a crew of technicians to confirm that all equipment and lighting was working as expected to accommodate future landings.
